A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING A PUBLIC DEPOSITORY FOR THE COUNTY OF SHOSHONE

WHEREAS, Idaho Code Section 57-128 permits the Board of County Commissioners to designate one or more banks, which are qualified public depositories as depository for money kept by the Treasurer; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners to

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award a portion of our accounts to P1FCU in Osburn.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners to keep the remaining accounts at Columbia Bank, including the current Treasurer's account and Tax Collector account, all of which are collateralized with securities up to the total of all balances that the County has on deposit over FDIC limit and leave the credit card services at Columbia Bank; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Treasurer's Department reserves the right to move any accounts between Columbia Bank & P1FCU in what best serves the County's needs.

Commissioner Huber attended the Silver Valley Transportation annual meeting at 10:00 in Kellogg at the Idaho Health and Welfare Office.

The Board convened at 2:00 p.m. to hold a Public Workshop regarding the Big Creek Bridge in Calder Idaho and local land use in that area. Also, in attendance was Shoshone County Public Works, Jim Cason and Stephanie Featherstone, Planning and Zoning Department, Monica Miller, Steve Syrcle with Tri-State Consulting, and Matt Beehner. There was open discussion of the Big Creek/St. Joe River confluence area known problems, possible solutions and additional work items which included: public mis-use of the County water withdrawal ramp and near water areas, trespasses onto the adjacent private property via the ramp, potential non-allowable uses by the local outfitter, Block 6 lot accesses via current County right of way. Block 6 access road and other personal property located on the dedicated easement and/or current County right of way, permitted water withdrawal IDNR assigned location and season water availability. Big Creek Park ownership lineage and exclusive rights for the subdivision, future signage and access changes, and general County excess right of way strategies. The group agreed that more research into the area and issues is required and plans to meet again to discuss further.
