11:00 AM The Board met with Howard Lunderstadt, USDA Area Loan Specialist, to discuss possible financing for a future Safety Building for Shoshone County Sheriff's department.

Also in attendance: Shoshone County Sheriff's Department, Mike Gunderson, Lance Stuzke and Matt Beehner. Commissioner Fitzgerald wanted to start the meeting noting how deplorable the current jail conditions are. Sheriff Gunderson added that the jail is getting to a point where the facility is in such bad condition, it soon will not meet state guidelines for inmates and the County will lose state funded money. The Commissioners and Sheriff's department have had extended discussions with a variety of different financial lenders and looked into different programs and have yet to find one that would work for the County, stating that the last bond that was put on for votes, didn't pass due to, they feel, was the time restraint the County was under to present it to the public. Mr. Lundstadt stated that with a USDA loan, as long as the County could get a bond to pass, could finance the loan under different grants as well as the Community Facilities Program, with a 30-year fixed rate, no loan fees. He stated the County does fall under the specific guidelines to finance and is eligible but does require the publics backing with a bond. There is also AARPA funds that would be available for infrastructure such as water and sewer and broadband, that would ease the burden on taxpayers. Mr. Luntstadt laid out a potential timeline and the process for getting started. The Board agreed they would like to have more discussions on a potential bond put on the ballot and what specific funds could be used from AARPA.

COUNTY OF SHOSHONE RESOLUTION NO. 2022-3

WHEREAS, the Board of Shoshone County Commissioners met for purposes of reviewing its December 2020, Emergency COVID-19 Compensation and Return-To-Work policy;

WHEREAS, the Board is aware of a statewide rise in COVID-19 cases and the recent declaration that North Idaho hospitals have declared a crisis standard or care due to limited resources and/or staff directly related to an increase in COVID-19 cases;

WHEREAS, the Board recognizes the importance of ensuring a safe and sanitary work environment for its employees and the public, and desires to support a healthy work environment;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to ensure consistency and clarity in its policy for employees and supervisors, and a result, an update to the existing policy is necessary;

NOW THEREORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the County adopts the attached "Emergency Covid-19 Compensation and Return-To-Work" policy for all County employees. It is hereby directed that this policy shall replace the County's existing "Emergency Covid-19 Compensation and Return-To-Work" policy enacted in September 2021 and shall be distributed to all county employees and supervisors.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that to the extent any employees are compensated under the terms of this policy, the County shall track those expenditures for purposes of seeking reimbursement from any federal or state resources related to COVID-19, including but not limited to ARPA funds.
