11:00 AM The Board convened in Executive Session per I.C. 74-206 (1)(f) To communicate with legal counsel for the public agency to discuss the legal ramifications of and legal options for pending litigation, or controversies not yet being litigated but imminently likely to be litigated. Also in attendance: Shoshone County Sheriff, Mike Gunderson, Keisha Oxendine, and Matt Beehner.

Commissioner Fitzgerald made a motion to go into Executive Session, seconded by Commissioner Hansen. Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Huber – Aye, Commissioner Fitzgerald – Aye, Commissioner Hansen – Aye. The motion carried unanimously. The Board came out of Executive Session at 11:22 a.m. with a motion from Commissioner Hansen to add to the agenda next week for review and discussion on budget for hiring a temp employee for data re-entry for the Sheriffs department and to have legal review and advise on the breach of contract with our data recovery company, CJIS, seconded by Commissioner Huber. The motion carried unanimously.

1:00 PM The Board met with Larry Kroetch and Rick Farrell to discuss, review and consider a portion of Benewah/Potlatch road, Calder, Idaho.

Larry and Rick are representing several landowners that live on a portion of road from Calder to Oxbo in Benewah County. They have put in a request to the Benewah County Commissioners to acquire that portion of land as it only serves as access for the land owners along that portion of road. There is not a need for public access on this portion of road due to the fact that it is no longer passable, and Shoshone County already owns and maintains the main road between Oxbo and Calder. Mr. Farrell's private property is highly impacted by the constant use of the public driving past the "road closed" and "no trespassing" signs while traveling through his private property to reconnect with the existing maintained Shoshone County road. According to Mr Kroetch they have met with the Benewah County Commissioners twice and were told that they (Benewah) are not interested in that portion of road and would like to vacate it to the current land owners. However, before the Benewah Commissioners will approve the vacation, because that portion of road (Calder to Oxbo) adjoins a portion of road Shoshone County might be interested

interested in (Oxbo to Falls Creek), they wanted approval from the Shoshone County Commissioners first. Public Works Director, Jim Cason, stated that the Roads Dept is really not in a position to take on more roads financially, it is a dirt road, and not normally maintained by the County anyway. In his opinion, there really isn't any benefit in ownership of that portion of the road and would only cost the County more money to maintain. The only benefit of the portion of land that abuts the portion they want vacated to Shoshone County is it could be an alternate emergency route if the main Calder road is not assessable. Commissioner Huber made a motion to draft a letter to Benewah County stating that Shoshone County is not interested in the portion of road from Calder to Oxbo, and the portion of road from Oxbo to Falls Creek they would like an easement to use for an alternate route if needed, with no public access changed, seconded by Commissioner Hansen. The motion carried unanimously.
