- Mark stated the Ambulance Service District have an ambulance that broke down
  and needs the engine replaced. Ambulance is otherwise in good condition and
  would be worth replacing. Weaver Diesel has the vehicle for repair.
- Working on purchasing a Demo Ambulance. Did not received the EMS Grant so will pursue purchase. It is in the budget.
