Chris introduced herself and her background to the board. She has worked with Ziply now for over a year in local government relations and grant writing. She explained that Ziply is eligible to apply for the US Treasury Capital Project Fund. There is \$120 million that will be available, with a June 19th deadline. Ziply is looking from Cataldo to Wallace and up Burke Canyon, just over 1,600 addresses. The Idaho Broadband office requires a community support letter. This would support Ziply coming to the Valley. Commissioner Casady made a motion to table the letter of support request for review, seconded by Commissioner Zimmerman. The motion carried unanimously. There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 10:17 a.m.

10:30 AM Culligan Water V/S Water Solutions

Tamie explained where the courthouse has Culligan systems today, and how much the cost is for each. Motor vehicles has one, about \$124.37/year. Public Works has one, about \$231.51/year. Assessor's office has one, about \$177.09/year. BOCC/Recorder's office has one, about \$176.76/year. Treasurer's office has one, about \$107.74/year. Magistrate court has one, about \$194.27/year. Probation services has an employee-owned unit not in the county's budget, but Tamie would like that to be put back in the county budget. Prosecutor has one, about \$238.97/year. District court/court records has one, about \$194.27/year. Totaling 9 units, \$1,783.72. Tamie outlined a few different options for Water Solution in the courthouse. Proposed option A for Water Solutions would include a unit in the basement common area at \$599.88. A unit in the Recorder's office with the ice option at \$1,428.00. A unit in the first-floor common area at \$599.88. A unit in the second-floor magistrate court, prosecutor's office and the common area at \$599.88 each. A unit in the third-floor district court/court records office and the common area at \$599.88 each. Totaling 8 units at \$5,627.16. Proposed option B would be the same as option A without the common area fountains, totaling \$3,827.52. Proposed option C would be option A without the ice option, totaling \$4,199.16. Proposed option D would be option C without the common area fountains on third and second floors, totaling \$2,999.40. Final option would be to keep the Culligan systems but adding the unit for Probation Services, totaling \$1,783.72. Benefits for Water Solutions include decluttering office space by removing water bottles, eliminating heavy lifting of water bottles to help avoid back injuries, using existing water from the courthouse, easy access for employees and the public, and eliminating old water fountains with safe water. Commissioner Casady noted it would be about a \$3,800.00 difference

a year for Water Solutions vs. Culligan. Commissioner Dose made a motion to put all water costs to Building and Grounds budget moving forward, seconded by Commissioner Zimmerman. The motion carried unanimously. Commissioner Casady made a motion to have the courthouse water tested, seconded by Commissioner Zimmerman. The motion carried unanimously. The board would like to see if the new chilling system in the courthouse will decrease the water bill over the warmer months. Commissioner Zimmerman made a motion to table the decision for 30 days, seconded by Commissioner Casady. The motion carried unanimously. There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 10:58 a.m.

Commissioner Dose will schedule a site visit with Public Works, Planning and Zoning and the commissioners to the area. Commissioner Dose noted the goal would be a paid parking facility to help offset costs of waste and law enforcement up the river. The board brainstormed ideas regarding re-leasing properties. Commissioner Zimmerman mentioned an auction, or sealed bid, to give everyone the chance to bid. Commissioner Casady mentioned utilizing free advertising, such as our website. Commissioner Zimmerman mentioned Shoshone county resident only leasing, he will check with the Legal department. Dan noted a need to put limits on different properties, seasonal/recreational vs. properties that may be conducive to the adjacent property owner. Commissioner Dose recommended pulling a list of recreational properties. Dan mentioned doing a similar process as the Tax Deed Auction that happens every year, with packets of each available property and related information. In the next week, the board will work on a list of recreational properties as well as think about packets for each property. Commissioner Zimmerman will work with the Legal department on a uniform lease agreement. Commissioner Dose will explore advertising options. Commissioner Casady will work with Planning and Zoning on the recreation property list. There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 2:01 p.m.
